Professional Judgment Process Overview

This application is a request for a review of special circumstances that you feel may change your financial aid eligibility. Professional Judgment refers to the school's authority to make adjustments to the data elements reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) so that the Department of Education can recalculate the Expected Family Contribution (EFC). The EFC is the number that the school uses to determine a student's eligibility for need based financial aid. The school does not have the authority to make direct adjustments to the EFC and can only change data elements that may change the EFC.

The UNCG Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships requires that you provide certain documents to support your claim of special circumstances. The Professional Judgment process is an extensive process that requires a thorough review by a committee of senior staff to determine what, if any, changes may be appropriate based on your application. It is a time intensive process that includes the following steps:

- 1. A committee will meet to determine if your Professional Judgment Application meets the basic criteria for further review.
- 2. If the basic eligibility requirements are met, the file will then be reviewed to determine if all required documentation has been submitted. If additional documentation is required the student will be notified via UNCG email.
- 3. Once we have received all of the necessary documentation we will first review the accuracy of the information initially submitted on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- 4. Once we have ensured the accuracy of the initial FAFSA information, we will then evaluate the Professional Judgment Application, make appropriate changes to correct the FAFSA file, and submit those changes to The Department of Education.
- 5. The Department of Education will then recalculate the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and the student's eligibility for need-based aid.

PLEASE NOTE: Even if the Professional Judgment process results in a lower Expected Family Contribution, the change may not be enough to generate eligibility for need-based financial aid or an increase in the financial aid award.

Points to Remember

- Applications based on loss of employment may not be reviewed until September 1st, 2023 to allow for a more realistic adjustment to income. You must provide the most recent documentation relative to the September 1st date. Documents submitted prior to September 1st may be considered out of date when the review process begins. If we have to request current information it will delay review of the file.
- Applications submitted after November 1, 2023 may (and will likely) require copies of 2023 W-2 and/or 1099 forms and may not be reviewed until a 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcript can be obtained.
- Applications submitted after March 1, 2024 must include a 2022 and a 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcript.
- We recommend you complete your current award requirements and accept any current financial aid that you need to use to satisfy your bill. Due to the nature of the Professional Judgment process, your request may not be completed before the payment deadline. You must pay your semester bill even if your Professional Judgment application has not been reviewed or finalized or your registration will be cancelled.
- All documentation must be submitted within 20 business days from the date of notification to keep the application active.

Note: The U.S. Department of Education provides in the Higher Education Amendments of 1998 a reaffirmation of the use of professional judgment in determining eligibility for federal financial aid. This provision allows for consideration of projected year income, rather than prior year income, to calculate a student's eligibility. If you and/or your spouse meet a special circumstance requirement in the 2023-2024 award year, your eligibility may be recalculated using income for 2023 or expected income for 2024.
