Associate in Arts (AA) to BS Professions in Deafness –
K-12 Deaf and Hard of Hearing Teacher Licensure Concentration

*SES 251 is offered every other year. If not taken in the selected semester, taking the course in the off year will impact the overall degree plan.

The Bachelor of Science in Professions in Deafness – K-12 Deaf and Hard of Hearing Teacher Licensure concentration requires a minimum of 120 semester hours (sh). UNCG requires a minimum 2.0 overall GPA for graduation. Students must maintain an overall GPA 3.0 or better throughout the program and receive at least a B- or better grade in all SES and related area courses. A student will be required to retake any SES or related area course if they earn a grade lower than B- in the course. SES courses are sequenced, to be followed in a prescribed order. Students will develop their individual academic plan with a UNCG School of Education academic advisor.

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The test is a written test containing multiple choice questions pertaining to ASL grammar and Deaf culture. There are also expressive and receptive portions on the exam where students are asked to video record their signing of prompts on the test or to watch a video of a signed prompt in which students must supply answers.

Students who have an American Sign Language Proficiency Interview (ASLPI) score of 2.0 within the past 6 months that can be verified with a copy of the certificate with the date the score was given will be granted direct equivalency transfer credit for UNCG's four-course sequence (i.e., SES 101:ASL I, SES 102: ASL II, SES: 203 ASL III, and SES 204 ASL IV).

Program Admission Requirements include:

- Documentation of an overall 3.0 or better GPA and 20 hours of documented successful experience

with children

- A passing score on the PEPSI (Program Entry Potential Signing and Interpreting) and SPIL (Sign Potential at the Intermediate Level)
- Signed and completed forms outlining Technical Standards, Dispositions, and Program Requirements
- Grade of B-or better in SES 250
- Completed application form and successful acceptance into the Teacher Education Program
- A passing score on Praxis I or documented passing scores on the SAT and/or ACT as required by the NC Department of Public Instruction

In addition to course work, the items below must be accomplished.

Completion of the Program Entry Potential for Sign Language Interpreters (PEPSI)

Completion of the Signed Proficiency at the Intermediate Level (SPIL)

Passing score on the American Sign Language Proficiency Interview
