The Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education requires a minimum of 120 semester hours(sh). Minimum grade of C is required in all courses listed under Major Requirements. Minimum grade of C required in all courses listed under Concentration Requirements. UNCG requires a minimum 2.0 overall GPA for graduation.

Students must apply for admission by July 1 to be admitted for the fall semester. In addition to admission to teacher education, a student who seeks admission to the Elementary Education major is expected to achieve:

- A grade point average (UNCG GPA) of 3.0
- A grade of C or better in TED 222, TED 250, and MAT 112
- Completion of all courses needed to fulfill the General Education Requirements (see Undergraduate Bulletin)
- Satisfactory scores on PRAXIS Core (or equivalent)
- Criminal Background Check completed
- Liability Insurance (included in internship classes)

~~All students majoring in Elementary Education are required to complete an approved second academic concentration consisting of 18 credits in a basic academic discipline or in an approved interdisciplinary studies program.~~

~~The following 18 credit interdisciplinary academic concentrations have been approved for Elementary Education: American Studies, Art, Diversity Studies, Environmental Education, Global Studies, Language and Communication, Science, and Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL).~~

~~The following 18 credit second academic concentrations are strongly recommended for those planning to major in Elementary Education: Biology or Chemistry or Physics, English, History, Mathematics. The following 24 credit second academic concentrations have been approved: French, Spanish. Elementary Education majors are required to meet with their academic advisor at least once a semester.
