

## Transfer Guide for Interpreting, Deaf Education, & Advocacy Services 2Plus Students

Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Interpreter Education.

Refer to UNCG's admissions website for more information on admission and transfer of credits. Credit will only be awarded for transferable courses for which a grade of C or better is earned. Refer to the NC Transfer Course List for full listing of courses by designation – UGETC, CAA GEN ED, Pre-Major/Elective.

15 SHCs of courses should be selected from courses classified as general education within the CAA. The following are the recommended courses for the most efficient transfer to UNCG. Other selections may be made from the AAS curriculums, but we recommend checking the <u>transfer credit planner</u> to see if those other options are available for transfer.

Students will be required to complete an additional 49 hours of technical major credits to earn their AAS degree. The following courses contribute to the student's AAS and are recommended for IDEAS 2Plus students. \*Some credits are not awarded until the AAS is complete. While UNCG awards direct equivalencies to our ASL language sequence, the SES language sequence has different content and so the applicability to that course work will be based on the results of a placement test. The placement test is available to students after formal acceptance to UNCG and have activated their UNCG email account. Students wishing to take the placement test will need to contact the Interpreting, Deaf Education, Advocacy and Services faculty to arrange the testing date and time after they have been officially accepted by UNCG and have a UNCG email address. The assessment is a written test containing multiple choice questions pertaining to ASL grammar and Deaf culture. There are also expressive and receptive portions on the exam where students are asked to video record their signing of prompts on the test or to watch a video of a signed prompt in which students must supply answers. Students who have an American Sign Language Proficiency Interview (ASLPI) score of 2.0 within the past 6 months that can be verified with a copy of the certificate with the date the score was given will be granted direct equivalency transfer credit for UNCG's four-course sequence (ie., SES 101: ASL I, SES 102: ASL II, SES: 203 ASL III, and SES 204 ASL IV).

A maximum of 64 hours will transfer from across all 2-year (Community College) institutions. Duplicate equivalencies up to the maximum can be converted to electives. Credits will be reallocated up to the maximum for the greatest benefit of the student if more than 64 transferable hours are found among the student's 2-year coursework. Only grades of C (2.0) or higher are eligible for transfer to UNCG.
